- 8. Paul also challenges Timothy to grow in understanding and be able to correctly explain the word of truth (2 Timothy 2:7, 15). What have been some of the biggest barriers you have faced when trying to better understand the Bible?
- 9. Pastor John acknowledged the several paradoxes within the bible, things that appear as contradictions. What purpose do these serve? How do they aid or inhibit in our understanding?
- 10. When it comes to the Bible, where do you hope to grow in better understanding?
- 11. If you were to set a three-month goal for your spiritual growth, what would it be? Why would this one be important?
