

## The Super Bowl

Ephesians 2:14-22: For he himself is our <u>peace</u>, who has made the two groups one and has <u>destroyed the barrier</u>, the <u>dividing wall of hostility</u>, <sup>15</sup> <u>by setting aside</u> in his flesh the <u>law with its commands and regulations</u>. <u>His purpose</u> was to create in himself <u>one new humanity</u> out of the two, <u>thus making peace</u>, <sup>16</sup> and in one body to <u>reconcile</u> both of them to God through the cross, by which he <u>put to death their hostility</u>. <sup>17</sup> He came and <u>preached peace</u> to you who were far away and peace to those who were near. <sup>18</sup> For <u>through him</u> we <u>both have access</u> to the Father by one Spirit. <sup>19</sup> Consequently, you are no <u>longer foreigners</u> and <u>strangers</u>, but <u>fellow citizens</u> with God's people and also <u>members of his household</u>, <sup>20</sup> built on the <u>foundation of the apostles and prophets</u>, with <u>Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone</u>. <sup>21</sup> <u>In him</u> the whole building is joined together and rises to become a <u>holy temple in the Lord</u>. <sup>22</sup> And <u>in him</u> you too are being built together to become a <u>dwelling</u> in which <u>God lives by his Spirit</u>.
