



## The God Who Serves

Who was the last person to wash your feet?

John 13:1(NLT): Before the Passover celebration, Jesus knew that his hour had come to leave this world and return to his Father. He had loved his disciples during his ministry on earth, and now he loved them to the very end.

John 13 (NLT): <sup>4</sup>So he got up from the table, took off his robe, wrapped a towel around his waist, <sup>5</sup>and poured water into a basin. Then he began to wash the disciples' feet, drying them with the towel he had around him.

Foot Washing in the Ancient Near East

1. Hygiene and comfort

John 13:6 (NLT): <sup>6</sup>When Jesus came to Simon Peter, Peter said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?"

John 13:8-9 (NLT): <sup>8</sup>"No," Peter protested, "you will never ever wash my feet!" Jesus replied, "Unless I wash you, you won't belong to me." <sup>9</sup>Simon Peter exclaimed, "Then wash my hands and head as well, Lord, not just my feet!" <sup>10</sup>Jesus replied, "A person who has bathed all over does not need to wash, except for the feet, to be entirely clean."

Foot Washing in the Ancient Near East

Exodus 29: <sup>1</sup>"This is what you are to do to consecrate them, so they may serve me as priests: [offer sacrifices].... <sup>4</sup>Then bring Aaron and his sons to the entrance to the tent of meeting and wash them with water.

Exodus 30: <sup>17</sup>Then the Lord said to Moses, <sup>18</sup>"Make a bronze basin, with its bronze stand, for washing. Place it between the tent of meeting and the altar, and put water in it. <sup>19</sup>Aaron and his sons are to wash their hands and feet with water from it. <sup>20</sup>Whenever they enter the tent of meeting, they shall wash...Also, when they approach the altar to minister by presenting a food offering to the Lord, <sup>21</sup>they shall wash their hands and feet...

Psalm 139: <sup>1</sup>You have searched me, Lord, and you know me.

<sup>2</sup>You know when I sit and when I rise; you perceive my thoughts from afar. <sup>3</sup>You discern my going out and my lying down; you are familiar with all my ways.

John 13:7 (NLT): <sup>7</sup>Jesus replied, "You do not realize now what I am doing, but later you will understand."

John 15:13: <sup>13</sup>Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends.

All serving, rightly done, is first and foremost about love.
