- 1. What stood out to you from this week's message? Why?
- 2. What comes to mind when you hear the word "righteous" or "righteousness"?
- 3. If you grew up in church, what did that church teach about being righteous or righteousness?
- 4. From Sunday's message what definitions did Pastor John give for "righteousness", in Hebrew, *tzedaka*?
- 5. In Matthew 5:6, Jesus tells us to hunger and thirst for righteousness. What does this mean? What would it look like?
- 6. Read Jeremiah 9:23-24. What does Jeremiah emphasize in these verses?
- 7. In what ways does Jesus' teaching help bring justice and righteousness to the earth?
- 8. One short-hand definition of "righteousness" is "to be in right relationship" with God and others. How would you describe a "right relationship"? What does it take, both with God and with other people?
- 9. What challenges you most from this message and concept of righteousness?
- 10. Has your understanding of "righteousness" changed any since hearing this message and reading these passages? How?
- 11. As you look at your relationship with God and other people, where do you need to develop "righteousness" or pursue justice? Be specific.
