4. What things come to mind when you think of the “glory of God”?
5. How does this purpose and promise help shape your response to relationships?
6. Read Romans 8:12-18. How does the Spirit of God change our lives now and impact our future?
7. Where have you seen growth over the past eight weeks in your own faith? What about in your relationships?

8. Identify one meaningful moment of growth—a glimpse of glory—that you would like to remember and celebrate.

9. Is there one thing from this series that has stuck with you? Why is this significant?

10. Identify one area where growth is still needed. Write down your own prayer for that area:
