- 3. How did Thomas' doubt prove beneficial?
- 4. John 20:24-29 recounts how Thomas receives physical proof to his doubt. What does this passage reveal about Jesus? What does it reveal about faith and doubt?
- 5. Pastor Derek spoke about the importance of speaking out your doubt and then seeking it out. Why are both of these elements important in engaging doubt?
- 6. What doubts do you need to honestly speak out? How might you go about seeking direction and information for those areas?
